**SUBJECT : - RULES FOR EXAMINATION SCHEME LEADING TO
POST GRADUATE DEGREE COURSES IN AYURVEDA
UNDER FACULTY OF AYURVED AND UNANI.**
(Applicable from 2010-11 Admitted Batch and onwards)

WHEREAS by enactment of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act 1998, Maharashtra University of Health Sciences has been established and all the courses including Post-Graduate Degree/Diploma and Super Speciality courses in the Health Sciences defined under section 2 (17) of the said Act, 1998, have been affiliated to Maharashtra University of Health Sciences;

AND

WHEREAS by enacting the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 2001 and Maharashtra University of Health Sciences (Amendment and continuing) Act, 2002, Post Graduate degree/Diploma and Super Speciality of Health Sciences were temporarily carved out of the jurisdiction of the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and were reaffiliated to the Universities Specified in the schedule to Maharashtra Universities Act 1994;

AND

WHEREAS under the Maharashtra Universities of Health Sciences (Amendment) Ordinance 2005 issued on 31st October, 2005, the Post Graduate Degree/Diploma and Super Speciality courses in Health sciences have again been reaffiliated to the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences from the Academic year 2006 – 2007;

AND

WHEREAS it is a duty of the University to frame rules for teaching, training programme and examinations for Post Graduate courses in affiliated colleges / institutes in various faculties as provided under sub – section (1) of section 29 of the said Act;

AND

WHEREAS prescribing rules for conduct of examinations is a subject matter of Ordinance as provided under section 50 (vi) of the Act;

AND

WHEREAS such an Ordinance for the rules for teaching, training programme and examination for Post – Graduate courses in Ayurved faculty is not in existence;

AND

WHEREAS making of an Ordinance is a time consuming process; therefore I, **Dr. Arun Jamkar**, Vice-Chancellor of Maharashtra University of Health Science in exercise of powers conferred upon me under sub-section (8) of section 16 of Maharashtra University of Health Sciences Act, 1998 issue this Direction. It shall be called as "Rules for examinations scheme leading to Post Graduate courses in Ayurveda under Faculty of Ayurved and Unani" and it shall come into force with effect from the date of its issuance and it shall be applicable to students admitted for M.D./ (Ayurved Vachaspati)/ M.S./ (Ayurved Dhanwantri) courses from Academic Year 2010-2011 and onwards.

1. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:

1.1 The aims of the Post-graduate degree courses shall be to provide orientation of specialities and super specialities of Ayurved and to produce experts and specialists who can be competent and efficient teachers, physicians, surgeons, obstetricians & gynecologist (Stri Roga, Prasuti Tantragya), pharmaceutical experts, panchkarma tantragya, researchers and profound scholars in various fields of specialization of Ayurved.

2. METHODS OF TRAINING: -

2.1. Intensive training shall be provided in classical knowledge along with comparative and critical study in the respective speciality.

2.2. The emphasis shall be given on theoretical and intensive applied training and not in dictative lectures.

2.3. The students shall have to acquire the knowledge about the methods and techniques of research in the respective fields making use of Information Technology.

2.4. In clinical subjects the students shall undertake responsibility in management and treatment of patients independently and deal with emergencies.

2.5. The students shall have to participate in the teaching and training programme of under-graduate students or interns in the respective Specialities/Department.

2.6. In the first year of the course, the students shall have to acquire knowledge in the applied aspects of the fundamentals of Ayurved.

2.7. In the clinical training the student shall have to acquire the knowledge of independent work as a specialist.

2.8. In the specialities of Shalya Tantra, Shalaky Tantra and Stri Roga & Prasutitantra, the student shall have to undergo training of investigative procedures, techniques and surgical performance of procedures and management in the respective speciality.

2.9. The students shall have to undertake training in teaching technology and research methods during the course of studies.

5.) DURATION OF THE COURSE:

Students shall have to undergo a study for a period of three years after admission, out of which 1st Year shall be devoted to preliminary course and subsequent two years for speciality course.

Those students who have already obtained Post-graduate degree in one speciality and thereafter desire to undergo Postgraduate degree in other speciality will be given relaxation in study period for 1 year. They will be permitted, not to undergo preliminary course again, subject to submission of certificate of passing preliminary course of any statutory university.

Those students who have already obtained Post-graduate diploma in one specialty and thereafter desires to undergo Postgraduate degree in that concerned speciality and obtained admission under a seat reserved for approved teacher, will be given relaxation in study period of 1 year, but before appearing to final year examination they have to pass examination in the subject of Research Methodology and Medical statistics which is prescribed for preliminary course.

6.) ATTENDANCE:

6.1. During preliminary course, each student enrolled for clinical subjects (Sr.no.10 to 22 as mentioned above at rule no.3 & 4) shall have to attend at least 75% of total lectures and 75% clinical work assigned to him / her.

6.2. During preliminary course, each student enrolled for non-clinical subjects (Sr.no.1 to 09 as mentioned above at rule no.3 & 4) shall have to attend at least 85% of total lectures, 75% of practical and 75% clinical work if assigned to him/her under any rule/ scheme/ project.

6.3. For non-clinical subjects the student shall have to work in the concerned department hospital as per the instruction given by his/her Guide / HOD & Head of the Institution and have to complete at least one Housemanship in any department as per availability & need of the institution during his/her course.

6.4. Before appearing in preliminary examination, each student enrolled for clinical subjects (Sr. No. 10 to 22 as mentioned above at rule no. 3 & 4) shall have to complete at least one housemanship in concerned department (It may be of nature of stipendiary/Non stipendiary).

6.5. While studying in main course (secondary) and before appearing in final examination, he/she shall :-

- i) Present at least **1 research paper** concerned with enrolled speciality at National/International/State seminars.
- ii) Publish **1 research article** concerned with enrolled speciality, in National/International/State Journals.
- iii) Attend **2 National/International/State level**, seminar/workshops/ symposium related to his/her enrolled speciality (attend during 03 Years Course).
- iv) Delivered at least **10 Theory Lectures** to Undergraduate students in presence of Guide/H.O.D./Other Teacher of concerned department.
- v) Maintain a **Log book** as prescribed by University with due certification.

While submitting Examination forms of Final M.D./M.S. students, the Dean/Principal should certify that the above conditions i) to v) are fulfilled by student and this certificate will be **Mandatory**.

7) **SCHEDULE OF EXAMINATION:**

Post Graduate Degree course shall have two examinations in the following manner :

- a) Preliminary examination shall be conducted at the end of one academic year after admission.
- b) Final examination shall be conducted at the end of two academic years after passing preliminary examination
- c) Examination shall ordinarily be held in the month of June/July and Nov. /Dec.

8.3) Special Note:

- 1) Paper No.1 is compulsory.
- 2) Under theory paper No.1, at least 20 marks in each section must be obtained by the student to pass, but the total of both sections should be at least 50 marks for passing the paper.
- 3) For Paper No. 2. student has to appear for either "**K**"-Varga" or "**Kha**" Varga" as per nature of his speciality enrolled for P.G. Course. "**K**"-Varga should be taken by those students enrolled for non-clinical subjects (Sr.No.1 to 9), as defined in above rule No.3. "**Kha**"-Varga should be taken by those students enrolled for Clinical subjects (Sr.No.10 to 22), as defined in above rule No.3.
- 4) For being declared successful in the examination, student shall have to pass all the subjects separately in preliminary examination.
- 5) There shall be only two heads of passing i.e. Theory and Practical. Student has to Pass in each head of passing separately and must secure minimum 50 % of marks prescribed for that head of passing.
- 6) The marking system mentioned in this direction and University question paper is only for the purpose of evaluation process.

- 7) The result of the student shall be declared as **PASS** or **FAIL** only in each head of passing.
- 8) If a student fails in one head of passing in any subject then, he/she have to appear for that whole subject in next examination.
- 9) The assessment of Theory paper will be carried out as follows :
 - a) Answer books for the subject 'Research Methodology & Medical Statistics' will be assessed by two separate examiners appointed for each section,
 - b) Each section of Answer book for the subject 'Maulik Siddhanta K varga or KHA varga' will be assessed by two examiners appointed from that concerned subject panel.
- 10) If a student passes in only one subject in all heads of passing prescribed for that subject then he/she get exemption for that subject for next exam.
- 11) The maximum number of students per centre per day for Preliminary M.D./M.S. Practical examinations will not be more than ten students.
- 12) If a student fails in one subject in preliminary examination he/she shall have to pass in that subject before he/she is allowed to appear in the final examination.

9.1) The final examination being conducted at the end of three academic years after admission to preliminary course, shall consists of following heads,

- a) Dissertation
- b) Written Papers
- c) Clinical, Oral/Viva and Practical Examination.

9.2) DISSERTATION:

9.2.1) SYNOPSIS:

Every candidate pursuing Postgraduate degree course is required to carry out work on a selected research project related with the subject matter of his speciality, under the guidance of an eligible and recognized Post Graduate teacher. The results of such a work shall be submitted in the form of dissertation. And for this purpose firstly Synopsis should be prepared by P.G. students.

a) Last date for submission of Title & Synopsis shall be co-terminus to last date of submission of Examination form and it must be submitted in the prescribed format as prescribed by the University from time to time. Language of Synopsis must be English and as per prescribed Fonts (For English: Verdana with size: 12, For Sanskrit quotation/references-BARAHA with size: 11) by the University from time to time)

b) After receiving the Synopsis from students, the Dean/Principal will arrange a meeting of Institutional Ethical Committee (Constituted as per guidelines prescribed by I.C.M.R.) on a suitable date but within 21 days of cut off date, notified by the Admitting Authority and all proposals of Synopsis shall be placed before the said committee for its consideration. It will be lawfull if the said committee arranges a discussion with P.G. student along with his/her Guide and Co-guide (if any).

c.) The Synopsis not accepted/not recommended by the Institutional ethical committee will be referred back to concerned student with a written letter specifying the reasons for its rejection or the corrections suggested by committee within 3 days,

d) All such rejected or subject to correction Synopsis will be prepared freshly by the student under the guidance of Guide and will be submitted again to the Principal/Dean office for approval of Institutional Ethical Committee within 7 days.

e) The Dean/Principal will arrange a second meeting of Institutional Ethical Committee on a suitable date but within 45 days before last date of submission, notified by the Admitting Authority and will submit all Synopsis before the committee for final consideration and their recommendations.

f) Two copies of each Synopsis recommended by the ethical committee, along with a CD (e-form of synopsis), shall be submitted to the University in the prescribed format and one copy of detail report of Institutional Ethical Committee, with Pre-M.D./M.S. examination form and as notified under the University circular in respect of "Submission of Title & Synopsis" on website.

g) After receiving Synopsis from the colleges, these Synopsis will be scrutinized by "Synopsis Approval Committee" constituted for this purpose by the University as per prevailing norms. This scrutiny will be carried out by the said committee at the earliest at the University.

h) After meeting of "Synopsis Approval Committee", the decision of the said committee will be communicated by the University to the concerned Principal/Dean of the college / institution.

i) After receiving approval to Synopsis by the University, the student should start actual working on Dissertation at earliest.

j) Guide must be a recognized P.G. teacher in the concerned subject and must fulfill norms of age, experience etc, prescribed by the University/ Govt. of Maharashtra/ C.C.I.M., Delhi, from time to time.

A co-guide may be included, provided the work requires contribution from sister department or from another Ayurved institution/other faculty recognized for teaching / training by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences. The co-guide shall be a recognized Postgraduate teacher of Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

k) 'Change of Guide' to a student shall be permitted with prior permission of the University as per Circular dated 16/04/2008 and as notified by the University from time to time.

l) Once the Synopsis is approved by the University, the proposal for change of Title along with justified reasoning & necessary documents of the student through Principal/Dean after following due procedure, can be considered by the University up to result declaration of pre- M.D. Examination. In such case the Term of student will be extended by the University.

m) Each student has to pay the prescribed fees (if any) for scrutiny of Synopsis at the time of submission of Synopsis to the Dean/Principal of the college. The late submission of Title and Synopsis proposal shall be liable to pay late fees as prescribed by the University from time to time.

9.2.2) **DISSERTATION** :

a) The subject of every Dissertation shall be practical oriented, devoid of unpromising specialities and helpful in the development of Ayurveda.

b) The Dissertation shall contain the methods and data of the research carried out by the student on the problem selected by him and completed under the guidance of the teacher approved by the University.

c) The Dissertation shall contain critical survey of relevant literature, methodology, results of the research, discussion on the basis of existing literature of the subject, summary conclusion, and references cited in the dissertation.

d) Once the Synopsis for Dissertation is approved by the Scrutiny Committee of the University, the student shall not be allowed to change the title or the proposed theme of work without permission of the University and in such case term will be extended accordingly. In case of title change complete procedure from pt. no 9.1 (a) to (e) shall be followed.

e) The registration of the student for P.G. Course shall be cancelled if he/she fails to submit the Synopsis within the period specified by the University.

f) No student shall be allowed to submit the dissertation before the expiry of one calendar year after date of approval of the Synopsis and before six months from date of final year theory examination. Provided that, the student shall continue his or her regular studies in the institution after submission of Dissertation.

g) The Dissertation should be written in English under the following headings :

i) Introduction.

ii) Aims or objectives.

iii) Review of Literature.

iv) Material and Methods.

v) Observations and Results.

vi) Discussion.

vii) Summary.

viii) Conclusions.

ix) Bibliography.

x) Annexure (If any).

h) The Dissertation shall be a literary presentation and suitable for publication either as such or in an abridged form.

i) The written text of Dissertation shall be not less than 50 pages excluding references tables, Questionnaires and other annexure. The Dissertation shall consist of not more than two hundred typed pages. It should be neatly typed in 1.5 line spacing on one Side of paper (A4 size, 8.27" X 11.69") for English – Font Verdana with Size:12, & Sanskrit -For quotation/references- BARAHA with size : 11, as prescribed by the University from time to time, and bound properly. Spiral binding should not be done. The Dissertation shall be certified by the Guide, Head of the Department and Head of the Institution (**Certificate page supposed to be detachable and placed after first page**).

m) The dissertation shall contain, a summary of not more than one thousand five hundred words and the conclusion not exceeding one thousand words.

n) In clinical photographs, if included in dissertation, the identity of subjects should be concealed. The names of the patients should not be stated in the master chart.

o) Regarding Individual student, college, guide and any sort of identity **should not** be disclosed in the thesis by any way.

p) Four hard copies of Dissertation along with three copies of University approved synopsis along with one set of DVDs thus prepared shall be submitted to the Controller of Examinations along with prescribed dissertation fee.

q) Candidate submitting Thesis/Dissertation after the last prescribed date shall not be eligible to appear in ensuing University examination even if he/she is issued Hall Ticket/Admit Card.

9.2.3) **ASSESSMENT OF DISSERTATION:**

a) Each Dissertation shall be assessed by two external and one internal examiner (other than Guide) appointed by the University as per Ordinance 01/2002(amended).

b) Each examiner has to furnish all details in assessment report attached with dissertation, prescribed by the University for the purpose

c) The dissertation shall be accepted only after the approval of all examiners appointed under sub-regulation (a) and in case of dis -approval of dissertation by only one examiner, then dissertation shall be referred to third neutral examiner.(neutral examiner means a eligible examiner from panel not appointed for that particular exam)

d) If the dissertation is not accepted, the same shall be returned to the student with the remarks of the examiners and the student can resubmit the dissertation after making necessary improvement and modifications in the light of examiners' report to the University after lapse of period of 6 months.

e) The student shall be permitted to appear in the final examination of post-graduate degree course only after the examiners appointed for the purpose have approved the dissertation.

f) Approval of Dissertation work is an essential precondition for a candidate to appear in the other heads of final University examinations (Theory and Practical). It will be lawful if due to technical and un avoidable reason the university is unable to declare the result of student's dissertation before commencement of theory/practical examination, then the students will be permitted to appear for other head of passing prescribed for final examination with special permission letter from Vice Chancellor, but the result of the said examination will be declared subject to approval of thesis.

9.3.2) Assessment of each theory paper will be carried out by two separate examiners and appointment of examiner will be paper wise. This work will be carried out at C.A.P. Centre as per University rules.

After receiving result from 4 Examiners, the University shall take out average of marks & result will be declared accordingly.

9.4.4) There will be separate Practical/Oral/Viva/Clinical - examination for each speciality, for total 200 Marks.

9.4.5) To pass in Practical Head of passing a candidate must obtain minimum 50% of the total prescribed marks i.e. 100 marks.

9.4.6) The examination shall be aimed to test the clinical acumen, ability and working knowledge of the student in the practical aspects of the speciality and his/her fitness to work independently as a specialist.

9.4.7) The clinical examination shall aim at a careful assessment of the competence of the student, so that his/her familiarity with Ayurved and scientific literature in the speciality could be judged.

9.4.8) The viva-voce part of the practical examination shall involve extensive discussion on any aspect of the speciality.

9.4.9) Student must carry one copy of his/her Dissertation for practical examination.

10) GENERAL RULES FOR ALL POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS

10.1) After admission to P.G. Course by any method by any time, decision regarding granting of the term, will be taken by the University authority and this decision will be binding on all students.

10.2) The stipend to the Post Graduate students will be paid as per Government rules and policies applicable from time to time.

10.3) The students admitted in Government Ayurved Colleges have to complete residency scheme as per government directives both in preliminary and main course examination.

10.4) If a student completes 36 month period/three academic years, before appearing to final examination from the date of admission, in this condition the candidate has to work regularly in concerned department/hospital till declaration of result of final year

10.5.) All the candidates admitted against seats reserved for Teachers or in service candidate shall be treated on par with other students for their work in the hospitals and shall undergo appropriate allied experience.

10.6) A candidate admitted to any Post Graduate Ayurved course will not be allowed to work in any other institute or will not be allowed to work as a Medical Practitioner in his/her own/private/aided/non-aided or any other type of dispensary or hospital or any other Institute. (Other than admitted college)

10.7.) The registration once granted is only valid if the respective Post Graduate guide/Head of the Department and the Dean/Principal of the college are satisfied about regularity ,clinical work, diligent persuasion of studies by the students as well as their good conduct.

10.8) An absence of 2 months or above from the institution without assigning any genuine and satisfactory reason would automatically amount to cancellation of the registration of the candidate.

10.9.) The student while studying in the Post Graduate ayurveda courses, if found indulging in ragging, anti-national activities, unlawful activities or contrary to the provisions of Acts and laws enforce by Government, provisions of Direction/Statutes/Ordinance of the university , will be liable to be expelled from the college by the Dean/Principal of the college.

10.10.) Every Post Graduate student, shall be under administrative and disciplinary control of the hospital where he is appointed. He shall obey the rules, regulations, conversions and practice of hospital in force and code of conduct laid down by Govt/ University/C.C.I.M. from time to time.

In case of breach of code of conduct/rules by a student, concerned authority of hospital shall take any disciplinary action including disqualification to continue further Post Graduate studies or any other lesser punishment which may it thinks fit.

The concerned Dean/principal shall take such final decision and communicate the same to the University within 07 days.

10.11) if any dispute arises between student and his Guide on any issue or disciplinary action then the matter will be referred to Dean/Principal of the concerned college.

If any dispute arise between student and Dean/Principal of the concerned college then the matter will be referred to the Vice Chancellor and after suitable enquiry the decision will be given and this decision will be binding on all concerned persons.

10.12) A candidate admitted to any Post Graduate Ayurved course will not be allowed to avail vacation prescribed by the University for the UG courses students.

10.13.) The students shall have to attend special lectures, demonstrations, seminars, study tours and such other activities as may be arranged by the teaching departments of college.

10.14.)The students shall have to undergo training in the department concerned and shall maintain record of the work done during the last two years of study(Main Course) in the speciality opted by him/her and have to maintain a Log Book prescribed by the University and has to submit dully certified from Guide, H.O.D. & Dean/Principal, for final year Practical examination
