SCHEME OF EXAMINATION FOR III BDS (New) Course

Examinations are conducted to assess whether the candidate has acquired the necessary minimum skill and clear concepts of fundamentals essential to his/her day-to-day professional work. Examination shall be held twice in a year.

- 1) Maximum Marks for each subject shall be as under:
 - a) General Medicine: 200
 - b) General Surgery : 200
 - c) Oral Patho-Micro: 200
- 2) It is essential to inculcate the habit of progressive learning everyday; therefore there is a need to have frequent tests. Minimum of three tests in each academic year to be conducted by the college as per the Internal Assessment Examination scheme.
- 3) **Attendance:**
 - i) Minimum 75% attendance in Theory and 80% in practical/clinical in each subject in each academic year.
 - ii) The Dean/ Principal is authorized to relax condition (i) above, by granting exemption upto 10% for less attendance on valid ground.
 - iii) The counting of attendance shall be from the start of the term to the end of the term.
 - iv) The student, who fails in University examination or do not appear in that particular examination is required to have minimum attendance of 75% both in Theory & Practical / Clinical in the next academic term and also required to work up to the satisfaction of the head of the concerned department in that academic term prior to his/her appearance in University examination .
 - v) The student will have to attend minimum 70% Theory /Practical classes in these subjects which are taught in that academic year, but having no examination at the end of that academic year. However, when he appears for University Examination in that subject the student will have to satisfy condition (i) above.
- 4) Notwithstanding any thing to contrary, in these rules, no person shall be admitted to an examination under these rules, if he/she has already passed that examination or an equivalent examination of any other statutory university.
- 5) Candidate securing 50% marks in Theory and Practical/Clinical + Oral and Internal Assessment separately and having minimum 50% marks in that subject as an aggregate shall be provided an exemption in that subject.
- 6) Valuation of Answer books as per university policy.
- 7) There shall be one external examiner and one internal examiner. Internal examiner will be from colleges/university area (Regional) to conduct practical/clinical examination in every subject. **The examiner shall have minimum experience of 4 years as an approved teacher of the university with post graduate qualification in that subject.**



- 8) The Dean of the college will be in-charge of the Practical/Clinical examination centre. Where it is not possible for the Dean to discharge this duty, he shall appoint Vice-Dean or senior most Professor to work as center in-charge with prior intimation.
- 9) The university shall pay the appropriate remunerations to the centre in charge and all others connected with the work of examination. The Dean shall inform the names of those persons before the commencement of University examination at that center.
- 10) The charges for the materials used for the smooth and proper conduction of University practical/clinical examination work shall be paid by the University on submission of original receipts of the purchases and certificate from the Dean about such material requirement and consumption. Prior permission from the University shall be obtained by the Dean from University in regards to number of items, materials quantity and approximate cost of the material. This will also applicable for examination in Basic Medical subjects.
- 11) Oral (Viva Voce): Maximum 20 marks allotted for each subject in oral to be conducted by examiners and the marks to be submitted in a separate sheet as per the pro-forma supplied by University. **Oral marks to be added to Theory Head.**
 - a) General Medicine: 20 marks
 - b) General Surgery : 20 marks
 - c) Oral Patho-Micro: 20 marks

Scheme of Practical / Clinical examination

*** Practical Examinations, University Practical/Clinical Examination : 90 marks**

- 1) The Practical/Clinical examination shall be conducted at the centres where adequate facilities are available to conduct such examination and the centre/college is approved/recognized by Dental Council of India.
- 2) Not more than 30 students to be examined per day in pre clinical subjects.
- 3) Each Practical/Clinical Examination shall not exceed 5 hours duration.
- 4) The marks should be submitted in the pro-forma supplied by the University, in duplicate. This pro-forma should be signed by the examiners.
- 4) Over writing or scratching will not be permitted. Any corrections made, must have the counter-signature of external examiner.
- 6) The sealed envelopes containing this pro-forma shall be submitted on the same day to the Dean for onward transmission to the Controller of Examinations, Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik and one for his custody.
- 7) No examiner or any other person connected with the work of practical examination is permitted to carry any paper or violate the rules of examination.



SCHEME FOR INTERNAL ASSESSMENT MARKS

III BDS - NEW COURSE



To assess the overall progress of the student by evaluating the professional skill he/she has developed and the knowledge he/she has got, it is necessary to assess the students periodically. The marks to be allotted should be real estimate of the student's achievement of skills and subject knowledge without any prejudice.

1. Maximum marks allotted for Internal Assessment for each subject head, i.e. theory and practical/clinical, will be 10% of the total marks.
2. In all, three college tests shall be conducted in one academic year. Each test will have marks as under.

	Theory	Practical/Clinical
First Internal Assessment Test	03 marks	03 marks
Second Internal Assessment Test	03 marks	03 marks
Preliminary Examination	04 marks	04 marks
Total	10 marks	10 marks

- a) **First** Internal Assessment Test should be conducted for the syllabus completed up to winter vacation and examination shall be conducted immediately after winter vacation.
 - b) **Second** Internal Assessment Test should be conducted for the syllabus completed in the First term and to be conducted two months after winter vacation.
 - c) **Preliminary** examination should include entire syllabus prescribed by the University (Preliminary Examination) and to be conducted at the end of March.
3. All the records of this examination will have to be maintained by the Head of Departments and will have to be produced for verification.
 4. All records of these examinations shall be preserved up to the commencement of the next University examination for that batch, by the Head of Department, in consultation with the Dean/Principal.
 5. The marks of all three Internal Assessment Tests shall be submitted to the Controller of Examinations in the proforma as shown in Appendix - A, by HoD, through the Dean/Principal of the college before 20 days of the commencement of the University theory examinations by hand delivery or by Registered post.



6. One additional examination should be arranged in the entire period of the course to help the student to avail the opportunity of compensating the loss due to his/her absence in any one of the Internal Assessment examinations (periodical/terminal/preliminary). Those candidates whose genuineness of reason for the absence is verified and who are permitted by the Internal Assessment Committee to appear for the additional examination can appear for such examination. Such an additional examination should be arranged after Preliminary examination and before University examination, in any case before submitting the final result of Internal Assessment Examination to the University.
7. In case the candidate fails in the University Examination, he/she should be assessed afresh for Internal Assessment marks. The Internal assessment marks of this examination to be submitted to the University Authority.
8. For repeater students, only two examinations in the term will be conducted. Each test will be of 05 marks each. Thus college authority should submit marks out of 10 by applying he same schedule. The best out of two of the Internal Assessment marks (Previous Assessment/New Assessment) to be submitted to the University for the computation of marks. For pre-clinical subjects practical, each test will be of 10 marks each and thus college authority should submit marks out of 20.

The marks obtained by the candidate as Internal Assessment will not be taken into account for passing the subject head, but will be added to the aggregate of that subject head.
