11) Syllabus (Theory):

1. Skin

Anatomy and Physiology of the skin, Basic skin lesions, bacterial infections, cutaneous fungal infections, cutaneous viral infections, Parasitic infestations, Papulosquamous diseases-psoriasis, lichen planus etc, Eczemas, Bullous disorders, Connective tissue disorders, Pigmentary disorders, Acne, Hair disorders, Nail disorders, Nutritional disorders, Mucosal disorders, Skin tumours, Basic Dermatopathology, principles of dermatological practice- Topical therapy and commonly used drugs, drug reactions, Introduction to skin surgeries, Cosmetology

2. Leprosy

Epidemiology of Leprosy, Classification and clinical manifestations, Diagnosis and Management, Complications - Reactions and disabilities, National control programme

3. Sexually transmitted diseases

Anatomy and functions of Male and female genitalia, Syphilis, Chancroid, LGV, Donovanosis, Urethritis, Viral STDs, Reproductive tract infections – Vaginitis , Cervicitis, Syndromic management of STDs, Psychosexual problems

4. HIV/AIDS

Epidemiology of HIV /AIDS, Natural course of HIV infection, Management of asymptomatic infection, Diagnosis and management, Antiretroviral therapy indications, regimen, toxicity, resistance, Post exposure prophylaxis and PPTCT and legal aspects of HIV

5. Cosmetology

Cosmeceuticals, Chemical Peels, Dermabrasion, hair removal, lasers, Scar removal, Pigmentary abnormalities, Facial hair treatment, Hair colouring-artificial or permanent dyes, Botox treatments, facial rejuvenation
